Today we are going to choose one animal from the story to write a letter to. We are writing a letter to ask for their help.

### Think about:

- 1. What is the problem we need help with?
- 2. Who are we going to write to?

Remember to start you letter with 'Dear' and write your name at the end of the letter to say who the letter is 'From'.

Have a try at using **but**, **because** and **so** to join two ideas together. These joining words will help us to explain **why** we need help and **why** we think the animal would be a good helper.

Below is an example of a letter asking for mouse to help.
