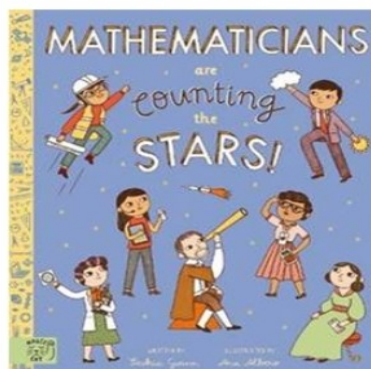


Recommended Read



Mathematicians are Counting the Stars! (ages 6-8 & up)

Author: Saskia Gwinn Illustrator: Ana Albero Publisher: Magic Cat Publishing



A little boy and his mum and little sister are looking at a book just like this one about mathematics. Mum explains that mathematicians are doing marvellous things every day, including making cars cool, looking inside your body, finding out how fast animals are and even exploring space. Does that involve finding aliens? It might!

In this beautiful and fascinating cartoon-style picture book, Saskia Gwinn and Ana Albero explain all the different ways that mathematicians are finding out brilliant things about the world and using maths to help our future. Each double page spread has a different focus: learning about earthquakes, constructing skyscrapers, coding computer games and many other fascinating topics. All of the chapters highlight the work of a number of modern-day and historical specialists who are using maths in their work, from architects to computer scientists, inventors, climatologists and astronomers.

There's also a lovely few pages at the end of the book which feature profiles of different mathematicians, from more well-known figures such as NASA mathematician Katherine Johnson, to lesser-known people such as astronomer Michelle Kunimoto.

Maths - In Maths, we have continued to practise how to count up to 20 by grouping objects in 10's and 1's. This is called place value (tens and ones).

Understanding the World - We have continued to learn about maps as well as how to give and follow directions. The children made a large-scale maze in the classroom using wooden blocks! They had so much fun during this activity!

We have been assessing the children's learning over the last couple of weeks. Their progress will be reflected on their end of year report which will be handed to you at parents evening.

Please make sure you are reading daily, it is very important for the children to consolidate skills they have been taught in school.

A big thank you for all wonderful fruit and vegetable donations this week, we had a brilliant time pretending to be chefs and putting together our own snacks at break times.

Year 1

Friday 17th May 2024

Dear Parents,

In English, the children learnt about the suffixes '-ing' and '-ed' as different endings that can be added to root words (verbs) to create new words. They also noticed that some verbs are irregular and therefore the word changes completely.

Examples: look/ looking/ looked. Irregular: bring/bringing/brought.

Then, they drew out the story of Hibernation Hotel and made their own story maps. Next week, the children will be retelling the story independently. This will be used as a form of assessment for the summer term along with any independent work they have completed throughout the term. I will also be assessing the children's reading levels.

In Maths, we have continued to learn about multiplication. This week, the children learnt about grouping. They used cubes to make different equal groups and added them together. They also learnt how to make an array.

In Alphabet Code, we reviewed the different codes for /igh/. We learnt /igh/ as in high, /i/ as in tiger, /i-e/ as in bike, /y/ as in fly, and /ie/ as in tie.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2
Friday 17th May 2024

Thank you for a fantastic week of learning. This week we have been so thrilled to see the dedication and resilience while completing our summer term assessments. A real highlight has been the acts of kindness and encouragement shared by all. We have started each day with a breakfast treat and worked in small groups to complete individual learning. Thank you for your support at home during this time. Your practice has paid off abundantly. I look forward to discussing your children's progress during our parent meetings.

We were extremely lucky to have so many parent helpers join us this week to begin to sew our Josephs coats! They are looking fantastic as they are now attached at the sides and have a button. Our next steps are to add pockets and applique.

In science this week we created beautiful butterfly art following our lesson on a butterfly's life cycle. We were surprised to learn that most butterflies only live for a few months and fascinated by their symmetrical patterns.

In computing, we composed our own music using [Chrome Music Lab](#)- please feel free to practice these skills at home. We have been really enjoying our music lessons recently and are so excited to share our singing with you in special mentions this afternoon.

In Re we learnt about the Muslim requirement of Zakat and how we could be generous to others around us. We noted that we could be thoughtful, considerate and kind- attributes we see a lot of in Y2. For homework please enjoy creating your own Islamic patterns, there are some helpful videos online.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 17th May 2024

In English this week we sequenced the key events of 'The First Drawing', and then we began to independently retell the story in our own words. We challenged ourselves to use many of the features we have learnt so far in Year 3 such as: paragraphs, direct speech, fronted adverbials, apostrophes for omission and possession and expanded noun phrases.

In Math, we began our time unit. We started by looking at Roman Numerals and discussing where we have seen them before. We noticed interesting patterns like how the Roman Numeral for 6 (VI) represents five plus one. We then looked at telling the time to five minutes.



There are 60 minutes in one hour.
60 divided by 12 is equal to 5.
Each interval represents 5 minutes.

The time is five minutes past 5.
Five minutes have passed since 5 o'clock.

In History, we learnt about why the Romans wanted to invade Britain. We discovered that Britain was rich in natural resources that would have been useful for the Roman Empire.

In PSHE, we talked about respect and discussed the many different ways we can show respect in different situations. We were then each given the name of a child in our class and wrote 5 kind things about them in the petals of our kindness flowers.

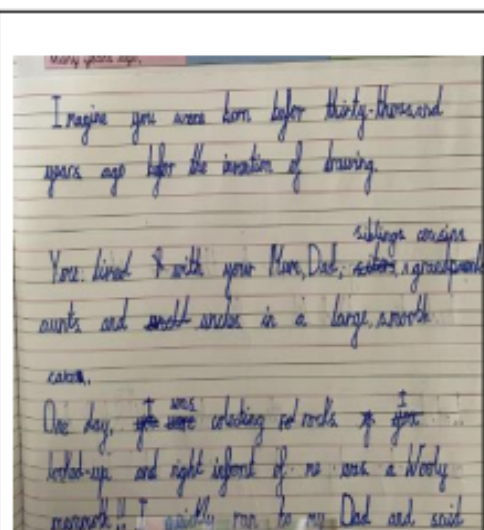
In RE, we learnt about the four Noble Truths. As a class, we thought about and discussed number two: 'suffering is caused by wanting'

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

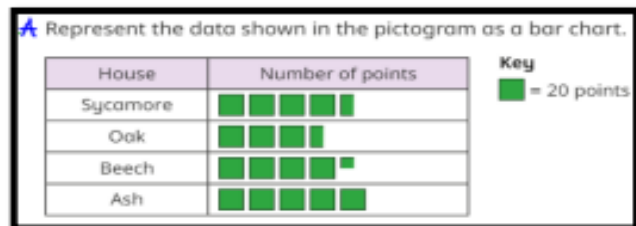

Highlights of this week include:

Maths

This week Year 4:

- Interpreted line and bar graphs.
- Revisited carrying out arithmetic problems.
- Practised two-step word problems.
- Explored quadrilaterals and triangles.



English

During English this week, children wrote a description of the ending of the animated film 'The Girl and the Robot'. This included writing in the 3rd person, using prepositional words and phrases and using commas to create a list. Year 4 did a fantastic job at managing the technical aspect of this piece alongside bringing in plenty of creativity.

Science

This week, we began our unit on the digestive system. This included comparing teeth and the bone structure of humans with other mammals. We learn that incisors help us bite off and chew pieces of food; canine teeth are used for tearing and ripping food and molars help you crush and grind food. The lesson also included a quiz on our previous unit, Electricity.

Geography

This week we started a new topic 'How is our country changing?'. Children learnt that the term topography means the physical features of an area of land. These features typically include natural formations such as mountains, rivers, lakes, and valleys. Manmade features such as roads, dams, and cities are also included. During the lesson, pupils located the UK on a world map; considered what a continent is and clarified the geographical and political terms: The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Great Britain, and the British Isles.

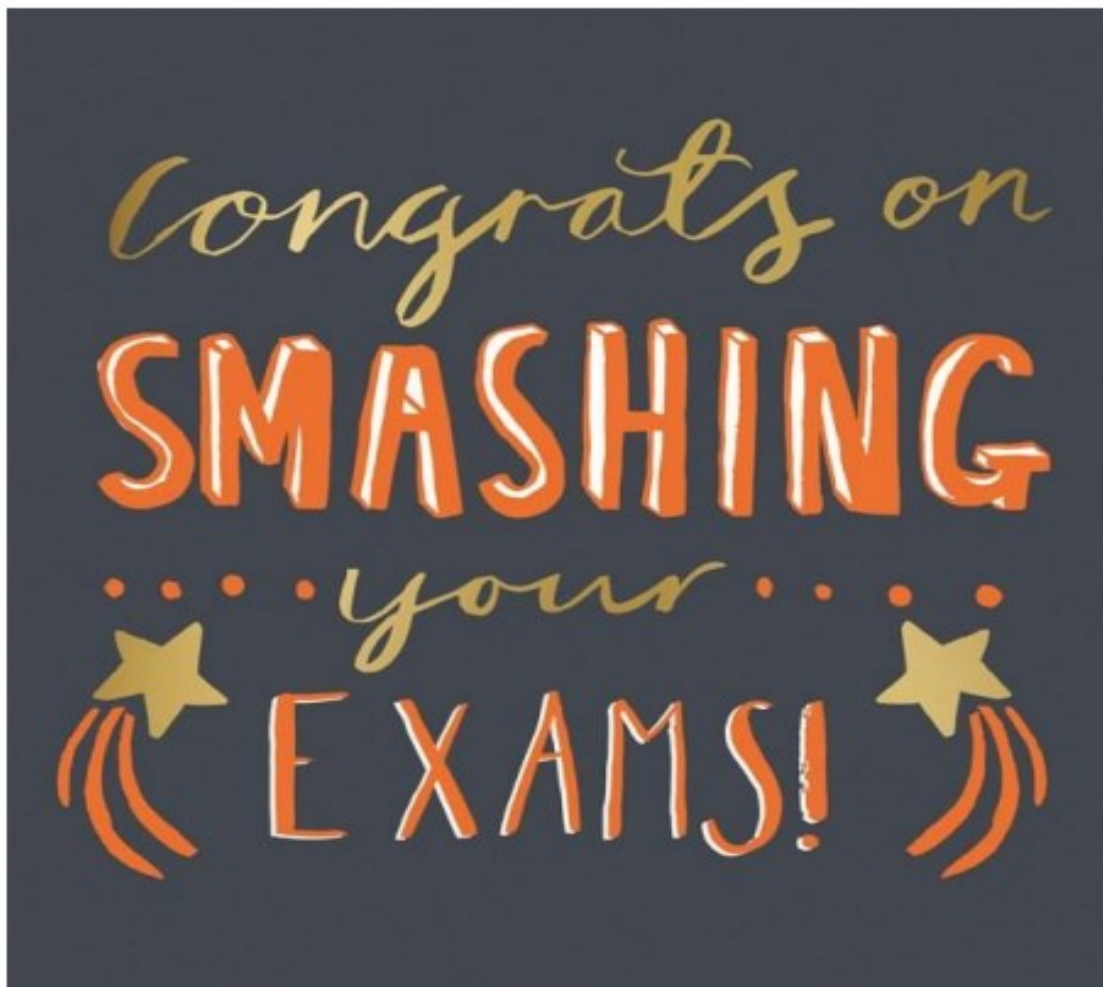
