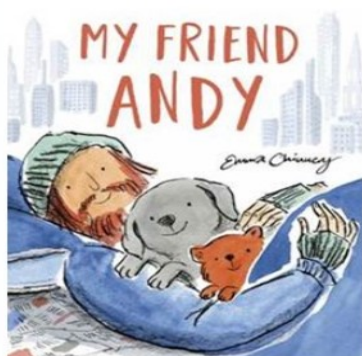


# Recommended Read



## My Friend Andy (ages 4-5 & up)

Author: Emma Chinnery Publisher: Little Tiger



Fluffy walks to the park everyday with her owner and best friend Lilly. Each morning, on their way through the bustling city, they pass Andy - a friendly, grey dog who is always up for a play! But for some reason Fluffy is never allowed to join in with Andy. Lilly's mum pulls her past on a tight leash. Maybe it's because Andy's owner is a little different to most people they meet. You see, unlike Fluffy, Andy doesn't have a warm bed to go home to when the sun goes down. One day, after becoming lost in the crowded city centre, Fluffy is found by Andy and his owner and together they share a wonderful adventure before returning to a relieved Lily.

Emma Chinnery's debut picture-book is powerful, poignant and gently interrogative – spotlighting the social dynamics of homelessness in a sensitive but direct manner. The story is narrated through

the dog's perspective which allows for its potentially challenging subject matter to be introduced from a position of innocence and objectivity. Complemented by charming watercolour illustrations, young readers will be immersed in the varied urban scenes. An excellent book to read with little ones to generate discussions around empathy and consideration for others.

### Clubs

There will be no changes to the timetable for Summer Term 2. Reflecting on the current timetable there are a few clubs which are underwhelming attended and at risk of being removed from the timetable.

These are:

Years 2 to 6 French (Mondays) is only around half full with a capacity of eight children. Considering this is available to five classes, this suggests there is minimal interest in this club.

Years 5 & 6 Minecraft (Tuesdays) has had only four children out of ten during Summer Term 1. We have already dropped Minecraft for years three and four and it seems that interest has dwindled in this club also.

Key Stage 2 Volleyball (Wednesdays) has struggled with attendance recently. Mr Escolar (AKA Marky Sharky) is a talented and experienced sports coach who thrives on coaching volleyball. He has seen some considerable improvement from the children who have persisted with volleyball over the last three years, but is concerned at the lack of attendance. KS2 extra-curricular sporting activities, competing against other schools, is a factor of this however there needs to be an increase for volleyball to continue.

KS2 Badminton (Fridays) is seasonal and will only be on until October half-term. Being that this is the case, we hoped for more interest. It is currently unsustainable and will not continue unless there is an increase in attendance. This has replaced Table Tennis, which we run in the colder period, but was also not well attended. It is possible that if these are removed from the timetable, a replacement will not be sought because the interest in a Friday sports offer is simply not attractive currently (in addition to Mr Rubangakene's.)

A big thank you to the parents of the children who continue to utilise the clubs on offer, for example: Art, Cooking, Fashion and Science. The success of these is down to your continued interest and support.

Clubs for Summer Term 2 will go live on Saturday 25th May. A reminder that clubs places are on a first come, first served basis. Clubs are booked via School Gateway, selecting the 'payments' option. If you have an issues/queries regarding clubs, you can email me at [nborder@ccht.rbkc.sch.uk](mailto:nborder@ccht.rbkc.sch.uk). I am away for the half-term so I will respond at my earliest convenience upon my return to work.

Please can I ask all parents who use wrap-around care to check their clubs balances and clear any outstanding fees. A reminder that childcare should be booked and paid for in advance of attendance.

## Governors Charging and Debt Policy

### May 2024



#### ***Our Schools Mission Statement***

Christ Church and Holy Trinity Schools are dedicated to providing a nurturing environment in which all children have the opportunities to reach their maximum academic, social and spiritual potential. Excellent teaching, learning and relationships are at the heart of our two schools.

#### **Introduction**

All education during school hours is free. We do not charge for any activity undertaken as part of the National Curriculum with the exception of individual or group music tuition.

#### **Voluntary contributions for activities as part of the Curriculum**

When organising educational visits or workshop activities which enrich the curriculum and educational experience of the children, the school invites parents to contribute to the cost of the activity. All contributions are voluntary. If we do not receive sufficient voluntary contributions, we may cancel the activity.

If a parent wishes their child to take part in an educational visit or event, but is unwilling or unable to make a voluntary contribution, the child is still allowed to participate fully in the trip or activity as long as parental consent has been given.

If appropriate and funds allow, the School Voluntary Fund may pay a proportion of the costs in order to support a visit. Parents have a right to know how each trip is funded.

#### **Music Tuition**

All children study music as part of the normal school curriculum. We do not charge for this. There is a charge for individual or group music tuition. This charge is paid directly to the individual peripatetic music teachers assigned to teach individuals or small group lessons on the school site. Extra-curricular clubs such as band and choir are available for sign up on the School Comms system for each child.

We will half fund up to 10 children per academic year who are less able to afford private music tuition.

#### **Swimming**

The school organises swimming lessons for two year groups of children per term. Lessons take place in school time and are part of the National Curriculum. We will ask for a voluntary contribution to cover the cost of provision of a specialist teacher, the hire of the pool itself and certificate and badge if attained at the end of their course of lessons. We inform parents when these lessons are to take place.

#### **Optional Extra Activities**

(Activities which take place wholly or mainly outside school hours and are not required in order to fulfil statutory duties relating to the National Curriculum or to Religious Education)

It is the governors' policy to charge for such activities organised by the school. The basis for calculating the charge will be proportionate for each participating pupil for travel, board & lodging, materials, books, equipment, entrance fees and insurance.

The following is a list of additional activities organised by the school, which require voluntary contributions from parents. This list is not exhaustive:

- Sporting activities which require transport expenses;
- Residential trips;
- School trips;
- Musical events



### Activities not run by the School or LA

When an organisation acting independently of the school or LA arranges an activity to take place during school hours and parents want their children to join the activity, such organisation may charge parents for example; Christmas Pantomime.

### Residential Visits

The school organises an annual residential visit for Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 pupils. The cost of this trip includes board & lodging, transport, materials, entrance to any sites visited and charges for any activities to be experienced.

The governors' policy is for the school to cover the cost of any additional teacher time necessary to lead the trip or subsequent follow up work.

Parents will be given the option of a payment plan to spread the costs of the residential visit. Any parent who feels that they will not be able to contribute fully to the cost of the trip should speak with the Federation Head Teacher, Head of School or Business and Finance Manager in confidence.

They will be asked to pay the initial deposit and the balance will be covered by means of invoicing the CC Trustees.

### Clubs

Clubs must be paid for in advance of a child attending the club. If a parent is unable to pick their child up for any reason at the end of the school day they must call the office in advance to let the office know that they will be running late or direct the office to book their child in to after school club and log in to school comms to pay off the club as soon as they are able. If there are 3 or more occurrences in one month where a child is not picked up and the school is not informed by the parent that they are running late, this will be treated as a safe guarding issue and the relevant steps will be taken.

If payment falls behind more than a month then a letter is sent home via the child's school bag.

If payment is still not made the School Business Manager will contact the parent/guardian by telephone to establish the reason and work out an action plan from there.

If you are experiencing financial difficulties, please contact the School Business Manager as soon as possible in order that we can work together to reach a mutually acceptable agreement.

The Federation Head Teacher will provide the Governing Body with details of any outstanding clubs debt and the current position with regard to such debt three times a year at the Resources Committee meeting of the Governing Body. It is the Governing Body's responsibility to ensure that this policy is applied fairly and consistently in order that the school budget is used to provide for children's learning and not to pay costs incurred by non-payment of clubs.

### Other Costs

The cost of ingredients, materials, equipment etc. needed for practical subjects such as food technology or Design Technology is budgeted for and borne by the school.

### Breakages & Fines

The Governors reserve the right to ask parents to pay for the cost of replacing any item that is deliberately broken or damaged, such as:

- Broken windows
- Defaced, damaged or lost reading books - £3 minimum charge
- Any item damaged as a result of unsatisfactory pupil behaviour.

### Special Needs

The governing body confirms that no pupil with special needs or disabilities will be treated any differently than any other pupil. The school will take all reasonable steps to avoid putting children with special needs at a substantial disadvantage.

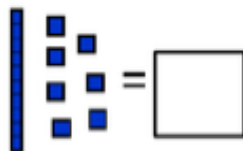

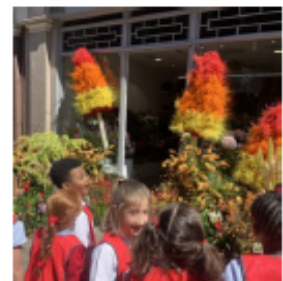

### Highlights of this week include:

#### Assessments

This week, the class took their Maths and English summer assessments. These included a reading comprehension, and arithmetic and reasoning papers (two in total). The children had the opportunity to review their marked papers to reflect on (and celebrate!) their results.

#### Science

For this week's lesson, we learned about food chains. The children discovered that producers are the foundation of the food chain and make their own food. Primary consumers are the next level up and feed on producers. Secondary consumers follow and feed on primary consumers. Tertiary consumers are the next level up and feed on secondary consumers, though not every food chain includes a tertiary consumer. Additionally, we learned that the last animal in the chain, which might be a secondary or tertiary consumer, is described as being at the top of the food chain and is not eaten by any other animal.

#### Geography

We examined the development of the Olympic Games in London 2012 by investigating the pros and cons of such an event. We learned that some local people had reservations about changes in their region. We also explored ways in which this development can be sustainable.
