Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June 2024

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Welcome back everyone! I hope you all had a wonderful half term break and well done for returning to school ready to learn.

In Maths, we continued looking at division and multiplication. This week, we focused on making equal groups and counting how many groups, how many counters in each group and how many counters altogether. We have also continued to practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's.

In English, we started a new storybook called *Julian is a Mermaid*. The children focused on verbs and writing commands. They wrote instructions for Julian to learn how to move like a mermaid. Then, they made predictions and inferences about the story.

Next week the children will have their phonics screening test! We will be checking their ability to decode and blend words. The children will be exposed to some real and made up words.

## Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June 2024

This week in English, we started preparation for writing our own newspaper reports for 'Holy Trinity News'. We began by looking at the key features of a newspaper report and identifying these features in real articles. Then, we practised our comprehension skills by reading short newspaper reports and answering questions about each report. Finally, we began planning our own article. We had the choice of three school events to report on: Sports day, our trip to Hyde Park, or the upcoming Shakespeare performance.

In Maths, we continued learning about time. This week, we focused on hours, days, months and weeks.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June 2024

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**Highlights of this week include:**

**Maths:**

This week, we have been learning about time. We started by converting between analogue and 12-hour digital times. Blank number lines were used to support finding durations of time and to help children find the start and end times of an activity. Children had to recognise that to convert PM times between 1 PM and 11:59 PM into 24-hour clock times, they add 12 hours to the time. They also learned that 24-hour clock times are always shown with four digits, so if the hour only has one digit, then a zero is placed at the start, for example, 09:45. Finally, children reinforced their understanding of the 24-hour clock format by converting to 12-hour clock times and representing them on analogue clocks.

**English:**

During English this week, children combined single and multi-clause sentences to create an exhibition label for an imaginary museum. This involved writing a title, describing where and when the item was found, and who donated it. Each label was also given its own ID number. After this, Year 4 wrote an informational brochure for the museum, describing a collection from the museum. This involved generating subtitles and creating bullet points to plan what their final information guides will be about.

**Science:**

This week, we continued our unit on the digestive system by looking at the structure and function of human teeth. We learned that incisors are used for tearing food; canines for cutting, and molars and premolars are used to crush and grind. Children had to draw a set of teeth and create a key to identify each type of tooth.

**Geography:**

For our topic, "How is our country changing?", we explored how the city of Coventry has changed by comparing maps of the city from 1850, 1950, and 2024. We learned how this city suffered significant bombing during WWII, as Coventry was home to many metal factories where ammunition was produced. Much of the city was destroyed, including Coventry Cathedral, which had to be rebuilt after the war. Other changes to this region were related to changes in society. For example, we learned that since 1950, many more people became car owners, so bigger roads were built to ease traffic in Coventry.

We have started our new English topic, all about space and a little Mars rover. We watched an interesting video about the galaxy which led to very interesting discussion about if there is life on other planets. We are continuing with reading our class novel, *Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief*, and have been working on comprehension questions as well as creating a profile for one of the characters from the first few chapters. Our knowledge of decimals is expanding and we are now working with thousandths, both as fractions and decimals.
