This week, in Maths, we started a new unit: Fractions. The children learnt that halving means splitting a shape, object or quantity into two equal parts. They also understood that two halves make a whole. During our Maths meeting, we began to learn how to tell the time. The children worked on recognising the different hand clocks and how to tell the time to the hour.

In English, we continued to work on the story *Julian is a Mermaid*. The children had fun designing their own carnival costume shops. They used persuasive language to convince people to visit their shops!

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2
Friday 14th June 2024

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 14th June 2024

This week in English, we began our newspaper reports. We started by carefully laying out our double page spread before choosing and writing our headlines. We then wrote our first introductory paragraph and then thought about what we should include in the main part of our report. We will continue writing these next week.

In Maths, we began our shape unit. We started by looking at turns and angles. First, we familiarised ourselves with quarter turns, half turns, three-quarter turns, full turns and used our knowledge of clocks from our time unit to help us. Then, we learnt that when two straight lines meet, they form an angle. An angle is the measure of the amount of turn between two lines.

And we can describe the direction.

Clockwise is when we move around the usual direction of a clock.

Anti-clockwise is when we move in the backwards direction.

Look at the starting point of the lolly. How would you describe each turn I make?

Here is a leaf before and after a turn.

Who do you agree with? Why?

In RE, we began our new unit 'Who is Jesus?' Each lesson, we will look at one of Jesus' 'I am' statements and try to understand what he meant by each of these. This week, we thought about his statement: 'I am the bread of life'. Ask your child what they think Jesus meant by this.

In History, we thought about why we still learn about the Romans today and some of the changes the Romans made to Britain. We discovered that the Romans brought many things to Britain, some of them more unusual than others. Ask your child to tell you something the Romans brought to Britain.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

Friday 14th June 2024

Highlights of this week include:

Maths:

In maths children reinforced their understanding of the 24-hour clock format by converting to 12-hour clock times and representing them on analogue clocks. Children used the knowledge that there are 24 hours in a day and that a new day starts at midnight, 00:00, to help them understand why they subtract 12 hours to convert a time after 1 pm from a 24-hour clock time to a 12-hour clock time.

DT:

This week, we were joined by Darcy Turner, an artist who specialises in 3D art workshops for kids. Our all-day session involved 'paper rolling' to make chairs. Children worked in groups of 6 and began by rolling 5 sheets of newspaper to make a tube with a 'tail'. This tube was placed into a newspaper rolling machine; glue was applied and then the paper was rolled into a very strong paper stick. This was repeated many times (some groups used over 40 sticks for their chairs). The sticks were then used by the children to create life-size chairs.

RE:

For this week's lesson, we explored what death means to a Hindu. Children learnt that for a Hindu, 'Atman' is the concept of a person's 'core' transmigrating to a new life, at death; 'Moksha' is the end of the cycle of rebirth and death and attainment of enlightenment. We also learnt that rivers symbolise lives flowing from one to the next.

Computing:

Year 4 walked to the Army Museum to take part in a 'Robotics' workshop. The children explored how robotic devices help the Army. Working in teams, they used block-based programming and Dash robots to complete a series of task. This helped develop their understanding of algorithms, and how to apply logical reasoning to write simple programs and solve problems.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 5 - Friday 14th June 2024

Year 5 is still working very hard this term!

We are really pushing our knowledge of decimals and percentages, working on our knowledge of thousandths and its relation to place value and other decimal numbers.

We are making cross-curricular links between English and History at the moment, connecting our knowledge of Greek mythology with our class text, *Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief*. We are then connecting this to traditional Māori (indigenous New Zealand) mythology through the context of Matariki, the Māori New Year (this year held on Friday 28th June). We created stars representing the nine stars of Matariki. We have even learnt some te reo (language) Māori!
