






# **Recommended Read**



# Nina Peanut is Amazing (ages 6-8 & up) Author: Sarah Bowie Publisher: Scholastic



Nina Peanut makes "amazing and non-stupid" videos. Her 'How to Peel a Banana' clip managed to get two likes and her 'This Potato has a Face' clip even got a comment (admittedly from her best mate Brian). Despite her low viewing figures, Nina is confident in her creative genius and unique comedic style. But when an embarrassing video of her cat goes viral, she finds herself negotiating the intricacies of online fame, jealousy, rivalry and friendship - all while struggling to protect her creative in-

Sarah Bowie's graphic novel is bursting with creativity and humour. You cannot help being whisked along by Nina Peanut's infectious energy and readers will love the guirkiness that she brings to the story. The illustrations are full of comic details and hilarious captions and are sure to keep children engaged throughout.

As well as its humour, this book does also touch upon some important issues for its target readership. The difficulties of social media, popularity and cyberbullying are brought up and addressed in a positive and light

These themes will resonate with children who are increasingly confident using social technologies, especially as they are presented in a childcentred and unpretentious way.

This week, in **English**, we have continued to learn about sea creatures. On Monday, the children used their senses to describe what they could see, hear and smell under the sea. On Wednesday, they wrote a letter to the Rainbow Fish explaining how his behaviour had affected the other fish.

In Maths, the children learnt about odd and even numbers. We organised a teddy bear picnic and shared food evenly. The children understood that when the teddy bears didn't have the same amount of food the quantity would be odd.

On Thursday, we took a trip to Battersea Park Zoo to explore the inhabitants there, learning about their habitats and diet. We had a wonderful time playing in the park, followed by a picnic.

Dear Parents.

This week, in English, we have focused on poetry. The children worked on rhyming words and then, they all had a go at writing their own summer poems! I was greatly impressed with their work!

On Tuesday, we were lucky enough to have a 'Metal Bashing' workshop where we created some beautiful scales and fish. We drew designs, bashed them into metal, twisted metal into 2D or 3D fish and above all, had lots of fun. We loved being allowed to use the tools and lots of us showed how resilient we were even when our fingers felt like they might drop off!



In Maths, we continued to learn about fractions. This week, we focused on quarters. The children understood that a quarter is when we split a shape, object or number into four equal parts.

## Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2 Friday 21<sup>st</sup> June 2024

Thank you all for making this week so special! Miss Sebbak and I have had them most wonderful birthdays and there has been so much joy and laughter coming from our year two classroom.

This week we started a new text called 'The piano and the bear'. We have use the illustrations to write our own version of the story and made accurate predictions about what we thought might happen next. It is brilliant to see the range of expanded noun phrases used.

In maths, we are looking at positional language; including left right above below and next to. We noticed how clear our instructions had to be when we instructed a friend to make a block tower with instructional language.

During our computing lessons we began to learn more about algorithms using <u>scratch</u>. Please feel free to practice using this program at home.

We have begun to prepare for our art exhibition on Friday 28<sup>th</sup>
June. Year two will be showing a range of flowers inspired by each of
our key artists throughout the year. This week we finalised our
Monet inspired sunflowers.

In our design and technology lesson, we have evaluated our final coats and considered what we would change or improve if we were to complete the project again.

In preparation for our beach trip, we are learning more about parts of the UK, this week we identified key cities within the UK and matched landmarks, memorable food, and events that take place in each area.

We are now spending our Thursday mornings in Sedding street. We had a detailed tour to see the different rooms and resources that will be available to us in September.



Friday 21st June 2024

This week in English, we have continued writing our newspaper report. We tried to include the key features of report writing. Once we had finished and our report had been checked, we published our reports in our neatest handwriting.

In Maths, we continued our unit on geometry. This week, we looked at identifying and comparing different angles, and understanding the difference between horizontal and vertical lines. Next week, we will look at the concepts 'parallel' and 'perpendicular' and identifying and classifying 2D shapes.



In RE, we continued our unit 'Who is Jesus?' This week, we thought about what Jesus meant when he said 'I am the light of the world.' We discussed the importance of light and used these ideas to help us understand why Jesus would identify himself as light.

In History, we learnt about what life would have been like for children in Roman Britain. We learnt that life was very different depending on whether you were rich or poor. We then compared life in Roman Britain to life today and found similarities and differences. Ask you child which toys were popular in Roman Britain.

## Highlights of this week include:

#### Maths:

In maths, children continued to explore angles as a measure of a turn by comparing and ordering angles. We began by recapping acute, right and obtuse angles. Children saw that a right angle is a greater angle than any acute angle, and any obtuse angle is greater than a right angle. They identified different types of angles and used this information to compare and order the angles. They then moved on to comparing two angles of the same type. We also looked at examples and non-examples of triangles to help summarise the characteristics of a triangle: a closed, 2-D shape with three straight sides. Children then consider the properties of different types of triangles: scalene; isosceles and the equilateral triangle. We then turned our attention to quadrilaterals and learnt how to distinguish between a trapezium, a rhombus and a parallelogram as well as the familiar square and rectangle.

## Art:

This week, Year 4 completed their final watercolours inspired by the book "Journey on a Cloud." They used wet-on-wet and layering techniques to capture the whimsical and dreamy atmosphere of the story. The vibrant, expressive paintings reflect their creative interpretations and newfound skills.

### Science:

In Science, we explored the cranial structures of various mammals, examining diagrams to understand their unique features. They identified and compared different types of teeth—incisors, canines, premolars, and molars—observing how each type is adapted to the animal's diet and lifestyle. This investigation helped them appreciate the diversity of mammalian anatomy and the evolutionary significance of these adaptations.

## RE:

Year 4 students reinforced their understanding of the concepts of samsara and moksha by playing an engaging game of Snakes and Ladders. Each snake represented obstacles and negative actions leading to setbacks in the cycle of rebirth, while each ladder symbolized positive actions and spiritual progress towards liberation. Through this interactive activity, students deepened their comprehension of escaping samsara and achieving moksha, making the complex philosophical ideas more accessible and relatable.
