
As excited as we are for the Summer holidays, we are very sad to be saying goodbye to two much loved members of our team.


Dance Energy 2024

Packed Lunch Information

What is a healthy packed lunch?

Base each meal on a starchy food, such as bread, potato, rice, pasta, yam. Starchy foods give energy, fibre, vitamins and minerals.

Bread, try different types, such as sliced bread, wraps, chapattis, bread rolls, bagels or naan

Other starchy foods, such as pasta, potato.

Whole grain varieties are best for fibre, which is vital for a healthy digestive system.

Meat and Alternatives

Add some protein, for example meat, fish, eggs, beans or pulses. Protein foods build muscles and provide minerals.

- Lean meats, such as chicken, turkey or ham.
- Include oily fish, such as fresh tuna, sardines or mackerel at least once every three weeks.
- Cheese, such as cottage cheese, edam, cheddar or
- © Egg, such as boiled, quiche or omelette.
 © Meat alternatives, such as quorn or tofu Dishes containing pulses, beans or meat, for example curry or falafel.

Drinks, especially water, help children to concentrate and feel well. Water is freely available in school,

The school has a water-only policy so please do not put any other drinks in the packed lunch.



A healthy packed lunch is a balanced meal providing a variety of nutrients, to be found in four food groups:

Milk and Dairy Foods

Include a dairy product or dairy alternative, such as cheese, yoghurt, fromage frais or tzatziki. These foods provide calcium necessary for strong bones and teeth, as well as providing protein and vitamins.



Fruit and Vegetables

Don't forget to include fruit and vegetables. You can use fresh, frozen, tinned or dried. Fruit and vegetables are full of vitamins, minerals and fibre necessary for the body to function properly and to keep you strong and healthy.

- Add tomato, lettuce, cucumber or apple to a
- A vegetable dish, such as vegetable curry, salad or roast vegetables.
- Fresh fruit, such as apple, banana, pear or
- Dried fruit, such as raisins, apricots or dates.




Recommended Read



Transcendent (ages 9-11 & up)

Author: Patrick Gallagher Publisher: Orion/Hachette



Genius twins Kira and Jacob live in the sweltering heat and vibrancy of Mbale, Uganda. Their natural intelligence and strong sense of morality lead to them being recruited by a clandestine program known only as Transcendent.

This secret project aims to gather the most brilliant young minds in the world to lead an environmental mission in outer space. To prove they are up for the challenge, the twins must undertake three nailbiting trials against other genius candidates. Will they be selected for this most vital of missions? Is there more to this project than meets the eye?

Patrick Gallagher's debut novel crackles with energy, snappy humour and riveting action scenes. His experience as a teacher has clearly helped to make this an incredibly engaging read for upper Key Stage 2 — with motifs including advanced technology, gadgets, hacking and, of course, a strong focus on the environment.

He paints a rich image of life in Uganda, his mother's homeland, and interweaves aspects of his own experiences of dual heritage throughout the book in a meaningful but subtle way.

Fans of the Alex Rider series will love this adventure story and the addition of a female protagonist increases the demographic scope of its appeal.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

Friday 28th June 2024

Dear Parents,

This week, in English, we introduced the children to the wonderful world of acrostic poems. An acrostic poem uses the letters in a word to begin each line of the poem, with each line relating to the chosen word. This activity has allowed the children to explore their creativity and improve their vocabulary and descriptive skills.

The students enjoyed creating acrostic poems using words like summer, ocean, flower, and ice-cream. They came up with imaginative and thoughtful lines, showcasing their growing confidence in expressing their ideas through writing. We encourage you to ask your child to share their poems with you and even try writing some new ones together at home! They also wrote a poem using the letter in their names.

In maths, our focus has been on understanding turns and positional language. The children have been learning about left and right, as well as concepts such as above and below. These foundational spatial awareness skills are essential for their overall mathematical development.

To make learning fun and engaging, we incorporated interactive activities like playing Twister, where the children applied their knowledge of positions and turns in a playful context. This hands-on approach helped reinforce their learning and allowed them to grasp these concepts more effectively.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2 Friday 28th June 2024




Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3

Friday 28th June 2024

This week in English, we began a new unit themed around a short story called 'The Present'. In this story, a character has a change of heart. We discussed what this means before planning our own short story involving a character having a change of heart. We also practised using 'show don't tell', a technique where we use descriptions of body language to show how a character is feeling, rather than explicitly telling the reader the feeling.

In Maths, we continued our unit on geometry. This week, we looked at the properties of 3D shapes. We tried to use the terms 'vertices', 'edges' and 'faces' when describing the properties of each shape.



In RE, we continued our unit "Who is Jesus?" This week, we thought about what Jesus meant when he said I am the good shepherd.' We thought about all the things a good shepherd would do to look after their sheep. This helped us to explain why Jesus would call himself a good shepherd.

In History, we looked at artefacts and sites that were left behind by the Romans. For each thing, we identified what it was, what it tells us about Roman life in Britain and how similar or different



Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 4

Highlights of this week include:

Maths

This week children revisited and extended their knowledge of the names of polygons. We learnt that "gon" means "angled" and the different prefixes relate to the number of angles; for example, "pent" means five, so a pentagon has five angles and therefore five sides. We discussed other words that can help with the meanings of the prefixes, such as pentathlon and octopus. Year 4 then explored the meanings of "regular" and "irregular" in the context of polygons, learning that in a regular polygon, the sides are all equal in length and the angles are all equal in size. The children were surprised that a rectangle is irregular.

English

This week in English, children made final edits to their alternative chapters for the book Mr. Penguin and the Lost Treasure. They were tasked with setting the scene using suitable adjectives and adverbs, and varying their sentences by including simple, compound, and complex structures. Additionally, they incorporated direct speech. Once the chapters were complete, they assessed their own work by highlighting examples of the success criteria.

On Tuesday, Lara Hailey, an artist who specialises in felt making, joined us. We started the day with pieces of merino fleece which the children transformed into their own felt-designs. During the afternoon, pupils collaborated on three large piece using the theme 'migrating butterflies'. See below for the stunning results:

Children created their final watercolors based on Journey on a Cloud, a book inspired by Chagall's masterpieces, which worked to support Year 4's learning about one of the most popular artists of the twentieth century. These pieces can be seen at our very own art exhibition, currently at Cadogan Gardens.
