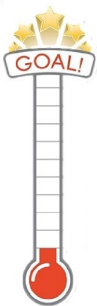
BOOK REVIEW COMPETITION

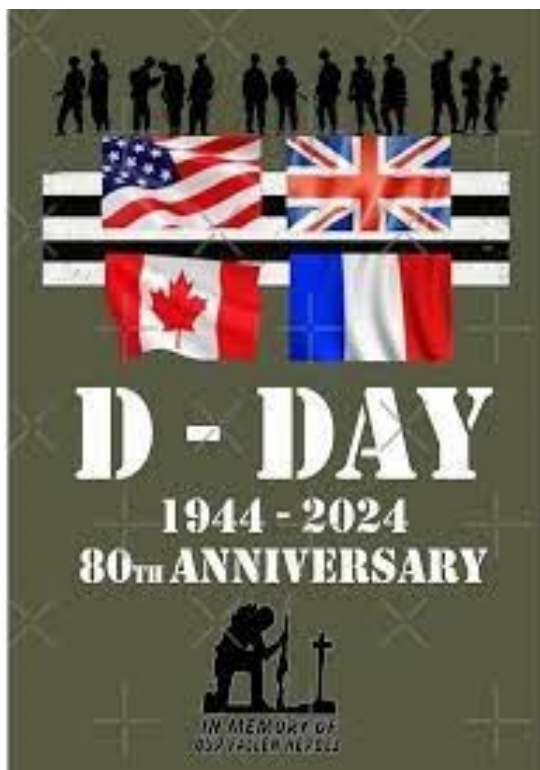

Thursday 6th June marked 60 years since D-Day. A series of major commemorations across the UK and France honoured the brave personnel who risked their lives for freedom and peace. Pupils at Christ Church & Holy Trinity have been learning about D Day and how we remember those who risked and also lost their lives during the war.

What is D- Day? The Normandy landings were the landing operations and associated airborne operations on Tuesday, 6 June 1944 of the Allied invasion of Normandy in Operation Overlord during World War II. Often referred to as D-Day, it is the largest seaborne invasion in history.

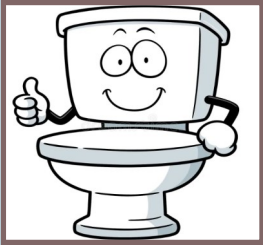

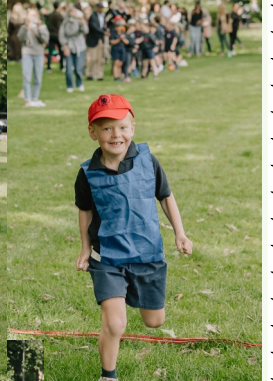

S.O.B.B - STOP One Battersea Bridge

This is a call to action to help STOP a vast and vulgar property development proposed to emerge right by Battersea Bridge. The project - entitled **One Battersea Bridge** - will destroy a precious, historical riverside vista - to line the pockets of a super rich company, its architects **Farrells** and their builders. They have NO regard for the repercussions of this design on the area. One Battersea Bridge (OBB) is the brainchild of **PROMONTORIA BATTERSEA**, a determined and experienced developer with a network of other businesses.

This project features a 34 storey tower rising to 119 metres, plus a huge chunk of other buildings. All this will be built right next to Battersea Bridge on its south side and beside the waterfront. Its scale and density for such a location is ridiculous on so many levels, not least the chaos it will cause during and AFTER its construction.

Make no mistake - this absurdly disproportionate development CAN happen unless urgent action is taken by YOU - the community, the council and beyond.

The deadline to make a comment about this to Wandsworth Council closes on 20th JUNE. We need you to step up and make a comment NOW. You can do it **HERE**.

Please put Netflix on pause, or stop playing Wordle, and spend a tiny bit of time to help STOP the grotesque One Battersea Bridge. This is not a silly sob story - this is *serious*.

The longterm purpose of this campaign is to have the project scrapped ALTOGETHER. It is *my* assertion that Promontoria and Farrells are deliberately and cynically proposing such a vast project - with a view to strategically absorb the complaints and then "offer to reduce" the scale to get it approved. This is an all-too common ploy by developers. In fact, Farrells used these exact tactics for the twin towers (laughably called "two dancers in the sky" by Sir Terry Farrell himself!) at its **Chelsea Waterfront** development bang opposite this new Battersea design.

Pass on the news. Tell your friends , your family, your schools and councilors. Bin this build. Back S.O.B.B Campaign.

Please *do* leave Comments, so I/we can get a gauge on what people are feeling. DON'T WALK ON BY!

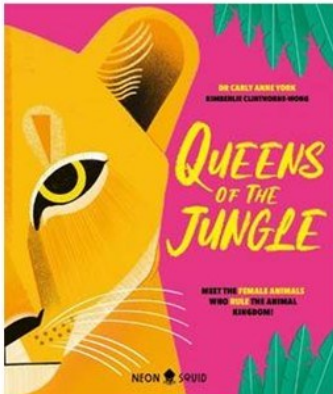

Reception Class Newsletter



Friday 7th June

This week we:

- Used *The Rainbow Fish* by Marcus Pfister as a focus for our writing. We used adjectives to describe his appearance and his personality. We also thought about how his unkind behaviour had made his friends feel and wrote a letter to him which explained why he was wrong.
- Learnt how to tell the time to the hour on an analogue clock. Some of us are even beginning to recognise when it is half past the hour.
- Used our skills of observation to draw the Rainbow Fish. In Art, it is very important to learn both skills of creating and copying. We made sure to include all the intricate details of his scales and used water colours, glitter and outlining in black pen to make our drawings really come to life.
- Revisited the codes /ear/ and /air/ in our Alphabet Code lessons.
- Took part in our very first Sports Day! We were all brilliant sports and had such great fun. Well done, Reception Class!

Next week, we will:

- Revisit the /ai/ sound in Alphabet Code.
- Explore place value to 20 in Maths.
- Visit Battersea Zoo.

Learning at Christ Church in Year 1

Friday 7th June 2024

In English, Year 1 have been retelling the story of 'Hibernation Hotel'. We remembered to follow a sequence and used time conjunctions to say when each event took place. We also used a range of conjunctions to join two sentences together.

In Maths this week, we have looking at doubling and halving numbers. We learnt that when you half a number you split the whole into two equal parts and when you double a number it means you add the two equal parts together.

For Alphabet Code this week we have been looking at the revising all the codes we have learnt over the last year and writing sentences to practice using these codes. Next week, we will continue to look at the /n/ code.

In Geography, we have continued our topic on around the world. We looked at some famous cities around the world, we then compared the similarities and differences and thought about which city we would like to live in and why.

In RE, we have been learning about parables, we read some famous parables and then thought about what they teach us.

In PSHE, we have been learning about the 'Zones of Regulation'. We have thought about our different emotions and sorted them in colours or zones. This is a useful to help us self-identify how we are feeling.

Learning in Year 2 at Christ Church

Friday 7th June 2024

Year 2 have had a cracking start to the term; writing up a storm in English, finishing their 'Time' unit in Maths and starting new topics in other subjects.

They've been planning their own alternate stories inspired by 'The Bear and Piano' which they will start writing next week. These stories will include examples of expanded noun phrases and contracted verbs. I'm always so impressed with their writing as they have continued to be focused and excellent learners in our SPAG and English lessons. Spellings will be set next week so there aren't any spelling lists coming home this week.

In Maths, Year 2 have been learning how to tell the time to/past the hour. However, telling the time to the hour is a really tricky concept and often, unless they have a solid understanding of quarters in fractions, this can be very difficult. If your child can tell the time past the hour that is amazing! When reading an analogue clock, please encourage them to focus on finding the minute hand first.

Our PSHE learning last term was all about ways to keep healthy. Sleep is an important part of our health and wellness and so homework this week is to keep a sleep diary. We will then use the table in our lesson next week!

We are really looking forward to our trip to the beach this term and starting new units in RE, Geography and Computing.

Learning in Year 3 at Christ Church

Welcome back to Summer 2. The last term of Y3!

In English this term we are looking at Poetry. This is such a fun unit to explore. We will be annotating a few different poems before creating our own later in the term. We will also be performing our poems, focusing on intonation and tone.

In Maths we have started our topic of Time. This can be a tricky topic, but Y3 have shown determination and persistence. We have reviewed half past, quarter past, quarter to and 5-minute intervals. Next week we will move onto converting between analogue and digital clocks. Have a go at practicing telling the time over the weekend, or whenever you spot a clock!

In Geography we have started the unit: Our Local Area. We spoke about what the word 'local' means and used maps to help us identify our local area around Chelsea. Y3 also looked at physical and human geography across the UK.

In RE we have started our unit: Who Is Jesus? This unit looks at what Jesus mean when he says: 'I am the bread of life', 'I am the light of the world', 'I am the good shepherd', 'I am the true vine' and 'I am the resurrection and the life'.

Learning in Year 4 at Christ Church

Friday 7th June

In Maths, we explored different ways of making 1 whole by combining tenths. Encourage children to use number bonds to 10 to support them, for example using $6 + 4$ when finding the missing number in $0.6 + = 1$. Representations such as ten frames, place value counters, double-sided counters, hundred squares, bead strings and Rekenreks to visually see the connections to 1 whole. We then looked at different ways of making 1 whole from hundredths. This step requires children to use their number bonds to 100. Initially, they may need to practise finding number bonds to 100 that are multiples of 10, such as $60 + = 100$. Then they can move on to the number bond to 100 for any 2-digit number, such as $63 + = 100$.

In English, we planned and wrote an alternative ending to 'The Girl and the Robot'. We generated adventurous ideas for what might happen at the end of the film and then used mind maps to structure our ending. In order to make our writing gripping, we used interesting synonyms, such as: gargantuan, sanguine and determined. We also included subordinate clauses with commas and sophisticated adverbs.

In Computing, we continued our unit on photo-editing and looked at the advantages and disadvantages of retouching a picture. We compared two photos and identified which parts has been edited and came up with reasons as to why people edit photos. We then used Paint.net to retouch an image of apples.

In RE, we started a new unit on Christianity: *Why is Liturgy important to many Christians?* We looked at what the main ingredients of Christian public worship are and why they are significant. We learnt how at every Eucharist, the Gospel reading must be read - this is to ensure the teachings of Christ are heard and explained in the sermon. The proclamation of the Gospel is reserved for the deacon or priest. The Gospel is often marked by people standing to hear it, a procession, lighted candles and incense.

Good questions to ask your child this week:

- What is the same/different about $7 + 3$ and 7 tenths + 3 tenths?
- What is the name of the punctuation we need to use direct speech?
- What are some disadvantages of retouching images on Paint.net?

Learning in Year 5 at Christ Church Friday, 7th June 2024

Another learning filled week at Christ Church has come to an end. It is incredible to think that the next 7 weeks mark the last term of the children in Year 5! They have come back from half term with lots of energy and desire to learn and it is great seeing them make the most of their time in Year 5 before they move on to Year 6! A very big well done to all the children for their enthusiasm and sportsmanship during sports day this Wednesday. Everybody had a wonderful time and many medals were won.

In English, Year 5 learnt about cohesive devices such as adverbials of time and place. Children used adverbials to connect their sentences in short paragraphs describing the various stages leading to Curiosity's take off from Earth and the first stages of its journey through space. They also learnt how to use the passive voice to write a formal log.

In Maths, Year 5 learnt about decimal numbers. They learnt how to add and subtract decimal numbers under 1, how to use number bonds to 100 and 10 to calculate complements to 1 and finally how to add and subtract decimals across 1.

In RE, children learned about Guru Gobind Singh, the tenth Guru. Children found out that this Guru came up with a unique test to find 5 men who were willing to sacrifice themselves for their faith in order to create a new community of united and faithful Sikhs.

In Art, children studied the difference between African and Indonesian Batik. Children compared and contrasted colour choices, patterns and details. Children used their observations to create their own Batik patterns.

In Computing, children are starting a new unit. They are learning to code programs using Crumble.

In History, children learned about the theatre, another one of Ancient Greece's legacies. They learnt that originally, theatre shows were held in honour of the God Dionysus and only three types of theatre genres existed: comedy, satyr and tragedy.
