Children who suffer from nut allergies can develop mild or potentially life-threatening allergic reactions. Some foods, especially after school snacks, need to be checked for their ingredients. Snacks for break time should be **FRUIT** or **VEGETABLES** only. NO **SWEETS** or **CHOCOLATE** allowed at school or after school clubs. Please can you check that you have no nut products in the lunch boxes or brought into the school:

- Biscuits / Cookies

This list is not exhaustive, so please check the packaging of products closely. We appreciate your help and respect with this and know that you understand the importance of this rule in place.



FUNDRAISING AT CHRIST CHURCH & **HOLY TRINITY**

Christ Church & Holy Trinity actively fundraise throughout the year to raise money for specific school initiatives that reinforce the academic

Through our parent Fundraising Committee and Parent Coordinators, together we forge positive relationships between parents and teachers and the wider community, to enrich our pupils' educational experience and contribute to the well-being of the schools.

Our Aim:

Our fundamental aim is to achieve all that is best for our pupils. Parents contribute to this partnership by giving up their time, offering their talents, or through monthly standing order donations or one-off contributions. We value our parents involvement and want our relationship to be a catalyst for positive change. We are driven by our mission to support and empower the children by making forward-thinking progress to the way in which they learn and flourish.

How?

In order to raise these funds we host our annual Promises Auction and Elf Auction at Christmas, as well as other events and activities such as Quiz Night, regular Cake Sales, termly Book Fairs, Art Sales, Bike Rides, Plant & Bulb sales, Christmas Tree sales, Music events and gigs, the Mini London Marathon and much more. Throughout the year we introduce new products and items in our online school shop where all profits from the purchase of these items go towards our federation enrichment programme, maintaining our co-curricular education to the high standards we continue to aspire to.

Our fundraising efforts are not solely achieved through our parent partnership work, we apply for government grants and bids and receive generous

donations from Charitable Trusts and individual donors wishing to make a significant difference





to our work, and they do. Pooling all of our resources is vital and it is how and why we are the schools that we are today. However, with the increase in the cost of living and many government cuts we must continue to give our time, money and efforts for the sake of our children's education. How can you help:

STANDING ORDERS

Families giving regularly is unbelievably valuable to the schools as it means we can plan ahead to commit these funds year on year to pay for specialist teachers, tutors, educational visits and visitors. The committed standing orders range from £5 per month to £500 per month. Families give as they see fit and as they can afford. All amounts make a real and tangible difference to the quality of education we are able to provide for the children. If you do not already contribute regularly please consider whether this is something you could commit to. Any amount would be hugely appreciated and it is totally anonymous. As of May 2024 it costs the school £120 per child per month to provide the fully rounded education they are currently receiving. Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 1

Friday 6th September 2024

Year One have had a busy few days settling into their new classroom and getting used to the routines of Year One. We know it is a big change, and each and every child has done so well this week! A big well done to all of Year One.

In Maths this week, we started our unit on place value. We began by sorting buttons into different categories. We used the story 'The Button Box' to help us identify different ways of sorting. Then, we focused on counting accurately and matching a number of objects to the correct number word or numeral.

In English, we have been focusing on writing simple sentences about things we like and our holidays. We have been practising checking for capital letters and full stops.

In Art, we drew our self-portraits which we will use to decorate our classroom very soon.

In PSHE, we looked at the Zones of Regulation and discussed the expectations of Year One.

In Alphabet Code, we are focusing on the **/ee**/ codes. We looked at **ee** as in b**ee, ea** as in l**ea**f, **y** as in happ**y** and **e** as in m**e.**

Thank you for such a wonderful beginning to the Autumn term. We are so enjoying getting to know your beautiful children! Thank you for trusting us with them, we are very excited for the year ahead! They have shared lots about their incredible summers. It sounds as though you have had a fun filled break.

On Wednesday we wrote a recount of our three favourite events. These we filled with our 'star words' (conjunctives) and were confidently read to the peers and celebrated as a class.

We also wrote our own introduction letters to share more of our hobbies and favourite activities. Next week we will begin our first text 'The Big Big Sea'. We will be writing our own setting descriptions and enjoy bringing the beach to our classroom. We will explore 'the beach' through our sense; feeling soft sand,

tasting the salty breeze, hearing the crushing waves. If you have been to a **beach** it would be wonder to have a **photo**. Please **email** it to Mrs Sheehan so we can describe the setting.

In Maths, we have been developing our understanding of place value. We have used dienes to make and compare 2-digit numbers. This will support our addition strategies.

We have created our own zones of regulation display, which outlines how we feel in each of our zones. For example, in the green zone we feel calm, ready, eager to learn. We talked through how we could feel in each zone at different points of the day and how we can regulate to feel calmer.

I so look forward to seeing parents and careers next Tuesday 10th at 9:30 to discuss our upcoming year.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3 Friday 6th September 2024

Dear Parents,

What an exhilarating start to the new school year! The children, along with our dedicated team, have seamlessly settled into their new classroom in the Sedding Street building. It's been a joy to reconnect and get to know one another, share stories from our summer breaks, and acclimate to our new routines.

In English, the students kicked off the week by crafting letters to Miss Jacobs, inspired by one she had sent them. They explored the essential features of a letter, analysing Miss Jacobs' questions as a framework for their own responses. Their letters, rich with details of their summer adventures, personal interests, and feelings, offered us a wonderful glimpse into their lives and personalities.

In Maths, we began by revisiting key concepts from Year 2 before diving into our first unit on Place Value. The children have been exploring the difference between numbers and digits, and are currently using counters and place value charts to represent larger numbers in terms of tens and ones. This foundational work promises to be a valuable extension of their prior learning, and I eagerly anticipate the progress they will make throughout the unit.

Additionally, we have spent considerable time familiarising ourselves with the new routines and expectations of Year 3. The students have enjoyed collaborating on our 'Class Charter,' applying for various classroom roles, and creating 'get to know me' artwork.

It has been a truly wonderful week and I am so impressed by how well the children have settled in!


Year 4 have had a terrific start to the academic year and the class have returned with a fantastic approach to learning. It is clear to see that all pupils managed to rest and rejuvenate well over the summer break.

Highlights of the week include:

Maths

This week pupils:

- Revisited counting to 1 000
- Studied the place-value of numbers with four digits (including using the expanded method)
- Identified and estimated numbers using different representations



English

This week, pupils learned to recognise and use the features of a letter. They edited a letter from Ms. James's primary school teacher to understand these elements better. After practising their editing skills, they gained a deeper understanding of how to structure and format letters effectively.

Guided Reading

We read the three chapters of our new class book 'George's Marvellous Medicine' by Roald Dahl. We studied the cover and children predicted what the book might be about. After reading the first chapter, we discussed the meaning of the word 'sympathy' and children considered who they had more sympathy for, George or Grandma (the two key characters).

Spellings:

We practised spelling key words used in Year 4. Based on this practice, children will be given words to focus on as part of their weekly home learning, which is due next week. The approach we use to improve spelling emphasises phonetic consistency.

History:

Year 4 reviewed the idea of 'childhood' as opposed to 'adulthood'; plotted significant events in their lives on a timeline and considered age restrictions for children and what they can do legally. The lesson was finished with analysing children's rights as proposed by the UN (Rights of a Child).
