

A Wild Walk to School (ages 4-5 & up) Author: Rebecca Cobb Publisher: Macmillan



Rebecca Cobb It's time to get ready for two adventurous sisters. Mum keeps worrying about them getting to school on time, but they have more pressing things to think about. For starters, they need to vigorously test out their welly boots to ensure they offer enough protection for the big adventure ahead.

> As they set off to school, it's not long before the girls encounter their first chance to be brave: the Shadowlands, where they have to be extra careful not to step on any patches of sunlight, otherwise they'll be turned to stone. Next comes a treacherous gulf in the ground, molten lava disguised as autumn leaves, and even a sleeping giant that looks a lot like a road speed bump.

Mum seems unbothered by all the danger and earnestly tries to get the girls to hurry up, but the escapades continue all the way to the school gates. Will

they get to school in time?

Both kids and parents will relate to this fun and witty tale. Told from the children's point of view, A Wild Walk to School brilliantly captures the contrasts of a child's imaginative mind with the everyday worries of a parent's morning routine. The easy-to-follow text is paired with Cobb's detailed coloured pencil drawings that are vibrant and wonderfully express the children's imaginative scenes.

### Learning at Holy Trinity in Reception

Another busy week in Reception class. Making our way through our baseline assessments alongside commencing our lessons focusing on Alphabet code and Maths.

In Maths, the children were introduced to Numicon shapes (1-10). Working on our counting and number formation skills. We have been using this song to help us with our number formation: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=DzKaCmiVXLI



Alphabet Code - This week's new sounds are: /a/ for apple /s/ for snake /t/ for tower

The children have worked on recognising the codes for the different sounds, practising their cursive letter formation and spotting the initial sound in words.

History and RE - As part of this term's topic, 'All About Me', we need both a family photo and baby photo of your child for the week beginning 3<sup>rd</sup> October. These can be sent into class, uploaded to Class Dojo or sent to the school office email.

### Learning at Holy Trinity in Year1 Friday 20th September 2024

This week in Maths, we practised counting back accurately from a given number, finding one less than a given number and comparing groups of objects by matching. Next week, we will be comparing numbers and learning to use the terms greater than, less than and equal to accurately.



In English, we practised writing simple, accurate sentences and we tried using adjectives in our sentences to describe different characters. We played a game of hot seating where one of us pretended to be the iger, and we needed to answer questions from our friends as the tiger. This activity helped us to understand the behaviour of characters from the story.

In RE, we continued our unit on creation. This week, we thought about how people treat creation. We looked at some of the things people do to help creation and some of the things people do that damage creation.

In Science, we looked at the functions of the human skeleton. We recreated our skeletons using straws and labelled key parts.

In Alphabet Code, we finished the /al/ codes. We looked at al as in

r**ai**n, **ay** as in pl**ay**, **a-e** as in cake, eigh as in eight and **a** as in b**a**by.

**EXAMPLES SEA** CHELSEA Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 2 Friday 20<sup>th</sup> September 2024

Thank you for a fantastic week of learning. It has been so wonderful to see everyone settle into Year 2 routines and make the most of the week. We have been so impressed with Y2's attitude to a 'new' friend of the day. It has been beautiful to see the class form a range of friendships and try different activities during playtimes.

In English this week, we worked extremely hard to write character descriptions. We have now planned our own beach stories and will begin to write these next week. Thank you so much for all the effort put into your homework, the use of adjectives and conjunctions fantastic to see. Please continue to sign up for our parent reader slot. It is a fantastic time to share your favourite stories from home with us. A big thank you to Roman and family who read a Mr Wolf's pancakes.

In Maths, we have been looking at the flexibility of partitioning numbers beyond tens and ones for example, partitioning, 52 into 31 + 21 we explored commutative law to understand a whole does not change if it is participant in a different way. We also began to consider missing values within a number line by finding the intervals and spotting patterns.

In RE, we discussed what a prayer is and linked it to The Lord's prayer. We thought about how prayers are present in a variety of religions and some Christians use it to communicate with God. We reflected on who we talk to and who we have to help us in our lives. Our art focus this week has been to create our beautiful Christmas cards. We have carefully sketched painted and outlined our own nativity scene percent and a draft will come to you soon.

In Geography, we considered where our food comes from and what processes it undertakes, this week we looked at the journey of a crisp. We sequences the events from farm to packet and even tried some crisps of our own.

Learning at Holy Trinity in Year 3 Friday 20th September 2024

Dear Parents,

We've had yet another fantastic week in Year 3, filled with hard work, fun, and exciting learning experiences. The children continue to put great effort into mastering their daily routines, earning valuable Golden Time as they succeed in our 'Routine Bingo'. They are doing exceptionally well, adjusting to the new expectations and challenges that Year 3 brings.

In Maths, we've been focusing on partitioning and representing numbers up to 1000, using various methods and models. The children have shown great enthusiasm, and today (Friday), we have a particularly exciting lesson where they will use models on their tables to practise partitioning. Look out for some wonderful photos of their work! They've been asking insightful questions and showing fantastic focus during their independent tasks.

In English, we've been exploring sentence structure, learning the difference between simple and compound sentences, and using fronted adverbials to enrich our descriptions. The children have risen to the challenge and particularly enjoyed the 'Fronted Adverbial Off', where they constructed sentences using modelled fronted adverbials. The w inning pairs earned an impressive five dojo points each for their 'excellent learning'.

In Science, the children have been captivated by their study of the human skeleton. They've been eagerly identifying the different bones, learning about their functions, and discovering how joints, cartilage, and connective tissues work together to keep our bodies moving. Our class text, *Danny, the Champion of the World*, has also been a hit, sparking great discussions and curiosity.

On Tuesday morning, the children were thrilled to have their recorder lesson, a huge hit! A big thank you to Mrs Ross for organising this wonderful opportunity with the Borough. We've included some pictures to capture the lively session.

#### Maths

This week, pupils:

- Flexibly partitioned numbers up to ten thousand
- Labelled, identified, and found missing values on
- number lines
- Estimated values on a number line

English

This week, pupils:

- Explored using conjunctions (For, And, Nor, But, Or, Yet) to link two simple sentences into one compound sentence
- · Considered how adverbs modify verbs and adjectives (degree adverbs)
- Planned a diary entry for a day in the life of the explorer Tadeo Jones (a character from an animation)
- Practised using a thesaurus to find synonyms.

### Handwriting

Pupils continued to practise their handwriting skills with a focused session on this art. We are using high-frequency words to refine both handwriting and spelling skills.

### History:

This week in history, children explored the terms AD/BC, BCE, and CE. They then created timelines of key historical periods, starting from the Iron Age and including the Roman, Tudor, and Victorian periods.

### RE

During RE, we read a passage from Genesis and identified the promises God made to Abram. We then discussed how these promises shaped Abram's journey and what they signify in the wider context of faith.

#### Reading:

Year 4 continued with our class book George's Marvellous Medicine. In addition to reading further, children answered comprehension questions on Chapters 1-3.

Friday 20th September 2024

This week in Maths we continued exploring numbers up to 1 million, including learning to read and write numbers with hundreds of thousands and finding 10/100/1,000/10,000/ 100,000 more or less than a given number. We finished off the week by partitioning these big numbers flexibly.

This week in English, we continued with looking at the Swing of Change. We have been focussed on direct speech, recapping when to use speech marks and developing this further as we learnt to start new lines with each new speaker and add punctuation before the end of any speech. By the end of the week the children put this into practice by creating a conversation between 2 characters from the Swing of Change.

The children were very thoughtful in their discussions of racism and discrimination in our English lessons and connected these discussions to our PSHE lesson where we were discussing identity and stereotypes.

This week children have started to bring home Home Learning books, reading books and Reading Records. There was much interest in their new homework system on ATOM, which we talked through using as a class.

Thank you so much for coming to our class meeting this week, it was brilliant to have such a great turnout. I look forward to getting to know you all better over the coming year.

This week in English, we continued with looking at the opening of Great Expectations. We were introduced to what personification and pathetic fallacy are. We finished the week with finding ways we could use personification to describe the wind and clouds from the scene in Great Expectations.

In maths we continued to look at place value and using number lines to compare and order 7-digit numbers. This encouraged us to have conversations about digits, how we know which number was greater/smaller and the distance between certain numbers on the number line. We finished the week by looking at integers and how we can order and compare them easily.

On Tuesday we visited the Charles Dickens Museum as part of the writing project. We learnt about the life of the famous author and how he narrowly avoided going to prison because his father was in debt! We enjoyed making links to our current English topic too.

Although it is September, strangely enough the classroom was filled with discussions about Christmas and Christingles. We were busy making Christmas cards and our theme was 'Christingles'. We recapped our knowledge about Christmas and what each part of a Christingle represents. Look out for our beautiful Christmas cards on sale later this term!
